MBA (PPM) Objectives

MBA graduates will demonstrate a command of contemporary business and project management literature, theory and practice. They will display high level professional skills and attitude. The MBA program focuses on both business (general) management and project/program management in an integrated manner. The dual focus enables the student to acquire a systemic view of how businesses are organised while at the same time learning how projects are conceptualised, developed, planned and executed within enterprises and different industries. Another distinguishing character is the focus on entrepreneurship and international business. Thus, the MBA aims to develop managers with vastly expanded knowledge and expertise in both business (general) management and project management, while embracing sustainability and social responsibility at both corporate and project/program level.

Entry Requirements

Entry into the program requires possession of a bachelor degree in a relevant discipline. Applications from those who possess other qualifications may also be considered. Required English Level: IELTS 6.5 (6.0 per band) or qualifications cited at: www.apicollege.edu.au. (Students who have completed a degree or diploma in English in a recognised institution are exempted).

Duration and Cost

Tuition fees stated below cover tuition, access to APIC's learning systems and tools, and assessment activities. Textbooks are additional. Fees are payable in instalments in advance for the units of study enrolled in a given semester. There is an Admission fee of \$100 (Non-refundable).

Duration: The MBA duration is 2 years of full time studies (4 semesters). It can be shorter when a student is granted credit for prior learning.

Delivery Method

Each unit of study typically comprises a 4-day intensive workshop followed by project studies that involve completion of 4 major team assignments (whose scope vary depending on the unit under consideration). The assignments are conducted on real life organisations where feasible. Students receive expert support during their project studies. The final assessment (viva) for each unit of study takes place upon completion of the project studies. The whole process is facilitated through mentoring and state-of-the-art frameworks, systems and tools.
